Since its establishment in 2019, the SZ-HK Medical Specialist Training Centre has established six specialist training proposals. With the support from Shenzhen Government, our Centre will launch a city-wide enrolment of medical specialist training in Shenzhen, involving all major hospitals. In the future, the Centre will play an ever-increasing role in medical specialist training in Shenzhen, including the design and execution of specialist training

proposals, the monitoring and direction of the teaching, and the selection and evaluation of trainers and trainees. Through our Centre, we intend to extend the successful experience of medical specialist training in Hong Kong to Shenzhen and the Greater Bay Area, and to make relentless efforts for the growth of medical education in mainland China.

In this issue of **academyfocus**, we are also proud to announce the new e-learning suite. Previously, Co-Chairmen of the Academy's Professionalism and Ethics Committee (PEC) Dr. James Shing-ping Chiu and I penned an Editorial in the <u>Hong Kong Medical Journal</u> in order to explain the duties and responsibilities of expert witnesses. The PEC has developed an online training course for Fellows to better equip them to become an expert witness, and this course will be among the first delivered on the new e-learning platform. #### eHKAM

In October 2022, the Academy launched the eHKAM online platform. The new eHKAM Portal will be the entry point for Fellows and trainees to all of the online resources from the Academy. Also under the eHKAM umbrella, a newly developed online learning management system (LMS) and the existing continuing medical education and continuous professional development system (iCMECPD) will form key part of a brand-new online experience for

Academy Fellows and trainees.

In order to provide convenient access, a new online credential (eHKAM ID), will be launched simultaneously. Users can sign in to eHKAM Portal using this credential, which supports the 'single sign-on' function. Once signed-in, users can conveniently access all systems and services provided under the eHKAM platform.


#### eHKAM LMS

During the Covid-19 pandemic, it has been difficult to conduct face-to-face teaching and learning for many educational institutes including the Academy Colleges. Online or digital learning provides an alternative way for the teachers and students to interact and communicate with each other. Online learning technologies allow teachers and students to communicate both synchronously and asynchronously. Students also enjoy the flexibility of self-paced learning by accessing online learning materials prepared by their teachers in their own time.

Since 2021, with the funding support from the Hong Kong SAR Government, the Academy has been setting up an online learning management system (LMS) for Fellows, specialist trainees, and other healthcare practitioners. To provide a LMS suitable for the varied use cases, a user needs analysis was conducted with inputs from different Colleges. User feedback and suggestions were collected through online surveys and focus group discussions. The data were then used to evaluate different LMS products. After going through the processes of product evaluation and tendering, the Academy awarded the contract to Instructure for

subscription to the Canvas LMS system, which forms the basis for eHKAM LMS.


In addition to the fundamental e-learning functions such as online guizzes and discussion forums, the eHKAM LMS learning experience will be enhanced by integrating with other technologies and the existing Academy systems such as iCMECPD. Now that the eHKAM LMS has been fully launched, it will be increasingly used to provide online CME/CPD activities and specialist training.

#### Conclusion of the HKJCDPRI Project


After 8 years of smooth operation and remarkable accomplishments of its goals and objectives, the Hong Kong Jockey Club Disaster Preparedness and Response Institute (HKJCDPRI) project will be concluded by the end of October 2022, as resolved by the Academy Council.

In concluding the HKJCDPRI Project, the Council commended that the Institute has fulfilled its missions, and noted that some of its existing functions could be continued and be taken over by the Academy's Hong Kong Jockey Club Innovative Learning Centre for Medicine (HKJC ILCM).

With the generous support of The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, the HKJCDPRI commenced operations in 2014 to provide advocacy, disaster education, promotion, and research for different sectors of society through an inter-disciplinary and multi-sectoral approach. Over the years, beneficiaries of HKJCDPRI initiatives have included the public; government partners; emergency and disaster responders; medical and healthcare professionals; counsellors and teachers; and students and parents.

#### **Commemorative Booklet**
