Dear Fellows and colleagues,

This autumn, we are pleased to announce the publication of our latest position paper on Postgraduate Medical Education (PGME), which builds upon a similar position paper released in 2010 and marks a significant milestone of our continual efforts in upholding the standards of PGME. This position paper covers key areas for development, including 11 recommendations on competency-based medical education, continuing medical education/continuous professional development (CME/CPD), faculty development, and quality assurance. We invite you to read the full version of the Position Paper, or the abridged version which has been published in the Hong Kong Medical Journal.

In response to the rapidly evolving field of artificial intelligence (AI) in healthcare, the Academy has engaged discussions with its constituent Colleges and formulated a set of principles and guidelines on using large language model (LLM) or similar technologies for specialist trainees and Academy Colleges on the utilisation of such technologies in the preparation and the assessment of written assignments. These guidelines aim to empower specialist trainees to fully leverage the potential of these technologies while upholding ethical and professional standards. Furthermore, guidelines for contributing authors on the use of LLMs or similar technologies in academic publishing have been released in the Hong Kong Medical Journal. Please also stay tuned for a seminar on the ethical and responsible use of AI in healthcare, provisionally scheduled for January 2024.

The Task Force on Laws for Healthcare Practitioners under the Academy's Professionalism and Ethics Committee has released a set of Best Practice Guidelines on the responsibilities and conduct of medical doctors and dentists serving as expert witnesses. These guidelines aim to provide practical guidance to help expert witnesses fulfil their important roles in the administration of justice, the upholding of professional standards, and the maintaining of public trust.

The Academy is celebrating its 30th anniversary with a diverse range of events and activities, which are highlighted in the Feature Article of this issue. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all who have contributed to our success, and we eagerly look forward to the upcoming Gala Dinner on 8 December.

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eHKAM LMS



Since its launch in August 2022, the eHKAM LMS has proven to be an invaluable tool for trainers, course organisers, and trainees alike. Its user-friendly interface and customisable features have greatly enhanced the teaching and learning experience, catering to the unique needs of each user.


Currently, the number of users who have submitted CME/CPD quizzes through the LMS has surpassed 1,900. The seamless integration between LMS and iCMECPD

provides an efficient and automated way for updating Fellow's CME/CPD points based on their quiz results.

In addition to the CME/CPD quizzes offered by specialty Colleges and the Academy, the fully online course, HKAM Training Course for Expert Witnesses also awards CME/CPD points to participants upon successful completion of the required course modules. Completing this course enables participants to augment their proficiency as expert witnesses, further enhancing their medical-legal knowledge and skills.

To experience the user-friendly LMS and the uploaded learning resources, Academy Fellows and CSRs are recommended to register for an eHKAM ID either by submitting the eHKAM ID registration form or completing the registration process through iCMECPD.

YOUNG FELLOWS CHAPTER CROSS-SPECIALTY VIDEOS

After the success of the fourth Young Fellows Chapter cross-specialty video on cancer management, a fifth cross-specialty video on the management of a stroke patient will be launched soon.

The medical journey of this patient will be divided into three parts. The first part will cover acute stroke management including the cooperation of four specialties: emergency medicine, radiology, medical

neurology, and neurosurgery. The second part will focus on the multidisciplinary management of the patient's rehabilitation process, involving rehabilitation physician, orthopaedic surgeon, anaesthesiologist, urologist, ENT specialist, psychiatrist, and other allied health professionals. The final part will emphasise on family counselling by a family medicine specialist, with a focus on disease prevention and holistic patient-centred medicine.

Meeting with Delegation from the National Health Commission and University Representatives in Hong Kong

Under the coordination of HKJC, a delegation from the National Health Commission (NHC), led by Ms. ZHANG Yang (張揚), Director General of Hong Kong, Macao and Taiwan Affairs Office, paid a visit on 11 September 2023. Representatives from the two medical schools and the Faculty of Health and Social Science, PolyU also joined the meeting at the Academy Building on the same day.

The meeting primarily focused on how different academic institutions could contribute to and facilitate the development of postgraduate medical education in Mainland China, with financial support from HKJC, including the potential implementation of a scholarship/fellowship scheme for healthcare professionals from the Mainland to gain exposure and receive training in Hong Kong, thereby building their capacities in certain specialty areas. Further discussions on this matter coordinated by HKJC would be necessary in the future.



Following the productive meeting, the NHC delegation was invited to visit HKJC ILCM to gain firsthand experience of its state-of-the-art facilities and setup. A comprehensive tour of the centre was arranged, showcasing the sophisticated simulation training techniques utilised to enhance the skills of healthcare professionals. The visit to the ILCM further solidified the cooperative efforts between the Mainland health authorities and Hong Kong, paving the way for future collaborations in simulation training.
