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Dear Fellows and colleagues,

With the sultry weather upon us and schools having summer breaks, I hope many of you have had a chance to relax or enjoy a summer vacation with your family. Work and pace for the Academy, however, have not slowed down. Besides participating at several local events, I also visited the University of Glasgow and attended a conference held by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow with the Vice-President (Education & Examinations) on behalf of the Academy. The triennial conference, "Advancing Excellence in Healthcare", provided us the opportunity to meet many renowned experts including an Olympic gold medalist, and allowed us the chance for networking and strengthening ties with sister academies and colleges on the other side of the globe.

Collaboration is most important to enhance health education and training. Experts from different sectors and organisations can join force to reach a common goal. As reported in the last issue, we have been working closely with the Chinese University and University Hong Kong, with participation of the Harvard University and other institutions, to develop an operational centre of excellence in disaster preparedness, response, and management in Hong Kong. After months of hard work, I am delighted to report that the Academy has successfully obtained funding from the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust to establish a "Hong Kong Jockey Club Disaster Preparedness and Response Institute" (HKJCDPRI).

Our densely populated city, located in a region highly susceptible to natural disasters and health crisis, has also an increasing number of potential hazards resulting from mass gatherings being organised for various reasons. The five-year project aims to establish Hong Kong as a regional and international leader in disaster preparedness, response, and management as well as to promote resilience in the community. The HKJCDPRI, to be led and housed under the Academy, will provide training and become a central platform for ongoing professional education, networking, and policy conversations. The official launching ceremony is scheduled to be held on 20 August 2014; organisation work is in full force. Representatives from the World Health Organization, officials from Hong Kong and Mainland China, and world-renowned experts in disaster management will be participating to help us kick off the project. All Fellows are encouraged to attend and cast an eye on the exciting initiatives that your Academy has in the works with the ultimate goal of protecting and saving lives.

As mentioned in my previous messages, the Government believes the Academy, with statutory power to set standard, is the most appropriate body to develop a credentialling system in Hong Kong for patient safety. Our Education Committee has been working hard for some time to come up with a policy paper that would cover a general framework and set standards for credentialling via the 15 specialty Colleges.

Following the recent tragic incident of a patient who died after a four-hour liposuction treatment at a clinic, the Academy has issued a joint statement with the College of Surgeons of Hong Kong, expressing concerns about the practice of doctors and professionals performing potentially 'high-risk procedures' that require advanced training and experience. In the press statement, the Academy also reiterated its support for the Government's move to tighten measures in regulating the procedures performed at private healthcare facilities in Hong Kong.

I was subsequently invited by the Food and Health Bureau (FHB) as Academy's President to attend a meeting on 14 July 2014. FHB noted that the Academy is developing a credentialling system and requested the Academy to try her best to expedite the process, stating that the Government would show its support when this system is ready for implementation. In the meantime, FHB would let the

Legislative Council know that work on credentialling is being carried out and a framework would be introduced as soon as possible to protect the health and wellbeing of the public.

The Working Group formed under the Education Committee, with representatives from some Colleges, Hospital Authority and Hong Kong Association of Private Hospitals, will continue to discuss the roles and responsibilities of stakeholders in the credentialling process. It is proposed that the Academy's core role would be to set standards for credentialling via its specialty Colleges, by building on the existing CME/CPD system. And it is agreed that regulation and enforcement would need to be carried out by the Department of Health or the Medical and Dental Councils.

Another Working Group, also under the Education Committee, has been formed to enrich the content of the Academy's iCMECPD, a website with online service started in 2006 that allows Fellows a paperless means to do CMECPD and keep records efficiently. The Academy's official website, launched since 2000, has also been revitalised with a facelift. The design is more contemporary and the functions, hopefully, more user-friendly.

We have continued to follow-up on projects started last year for the upkeep of the 15-year-old Academy building. Some maintenance and repair works are inevitable to provide a comfortable and safe environment for the many events and activities that are held here. Our building is becoming increasingly popular as a place that could accommodate meetings of all sizes within and outside our profession. The Council and House Committee, advised by experts, will continue to look after this valuable asset for the Academy.

Nature of the Award

- c. essay or a review article (not previously published)
- d. original research (original research should have been approved by an institutional ethics committee where appropriate).
The Panel of Judges reserves the right to reject any application on grounds that the research was unethical.

The Award (a plaque and a cheque for **HK\$20,000**) will be presented to the winning author. The Winner of the Award will be notified 2 weeks prior to the presentation ceremony.

Free Trial of Part-task Trainers offered to College Fellows and Trainees (16 July-15 September 2014)

The Hong Kong Jockey Club Innovative Learning Centre for Medicine (HKJC ILCM) has been offering free trial of the Part-task Trainers to College Fellows and trainees. The simulators offered in the training included LAP Mentor, GI/BRONCH Mentor and HeartWorks Dual Transesophageal echocardiography (TEE)/ Transthoracic echocardiography (TTE).

Here is the arrangement for the free trial of Part-task Trainers:

1. The 2-month free trial period is from 16 July 2014 to 15 September 2014;
2. Each trial session lasts for 2 hours;

3. Each session can accommodate a maximum of 3 Fellows / trainees;
4. It is not necessary for the trainee to be accompanied by a Fellow;
5. Fellows / trainees who wish to book a trial session must complete a booking form and submit it through their College;
6. Booking for Saturday/Sunday/evening sessions must be made at least 7 days in advance; bookings for weekday sessions should be made as early as possible;
7. Bookings will be on first-come-first-served basis;
8. Should a Fellow / trainee be unable to attend a booked trial session, he must inform HKJC ILCM as soon as possible;
9. HKJC ILCM has the right to cancel any booking when deemed necessary.

Practical Mediation Training Course (19, 20, 26, 28 September and 3 October 2014)

The Hong Kong Jockey Club Innovative Learning Centre for Medicine (HKJC ILCM) will organise the Practical Mediation Training Course in 2014. It is a 5-day course intended for healthcare professionals who wish to undergo training in facilitative mediation, and will also be of interest to doctors, nurses, allied health professionals, patient relations officers and other staff with responsibilities of resolving conflicts in their daily work, including handling complaints from patients and staff members. The objectives of this Stage 1 Mediation Training Course are to ensure that it is of sufficiently high standard to enable the participants to receive credit towards mediator accreditation by Hong Kong Mediation Accreditation Association Limited (HKMAAL).

The course will be conducted by experienced trainer, Dr James Shing Ping CHIU with a team of local experts of mediators, trainers and coaches in mediation. This Stage 1 Mediation Training Course (MTC) combines didactic and experiential learning with role plays. By the end of the training course, each participant will have acted as the mediator in two simulated role plays. Participants will be assessed and have to pass in at least 1 role play with written feedback from the trainer(s) and/or coaches, based on Form 1 of the HKMAAL.

Simulation as a Teaching Tool: Instructor Training, 20-23 and 27-30 October 2014

The Hong Kong Jockey Club Innovative Learning Centre for Medicine (HKJC ILCM) will co-organise 4-day Instructor Training Courses with Center for Medical Simulation (CMS) in October. Two identical sessions are intended for educators who teach clinical behavioural skills using medical simulation. The IMS COURSES draw from the disciplines of aviation, health care, psychology, experiential learning, and organisational behaviour to explore a variety of simulator-based teaching methods. These methods are applicable across the health-profession educational spectrum, including undergraduate and graduate medical, nursing and allied health domains.

Led by faculty from Harvard Medical School, the workshops combine didactic and experiential learning with practice and feedback to focus on using simulation to teach critical thinking and crisis management.



Obituary

William Ian Rees Davies

Ian Davies was born in Wales, UK and died in London after a decade in retirement. Following schooling locally, at which he excelled, he went to London to study Dentistry at University College Hospital (UCH) from which he graduated in the mid-1960s. He then worked in the UCH Dental Hospital. He took an interest in Periodontology, due in part to a very charismatic Australian Periodontology teacher, Robin Powell, who suggested that Ian Davies apply for a Thuron Scholarship to the University of Pennsylvania (U. Penn) in Philadelphia, which had a very famous postgraduate programme in Periodontology. While at U. Penn Ian Davies also took a Masters Degree in Physiology, as well as completing the Periodontology, postgraduate programme. As a Thuron Scholar, Ian Davies had a host family, The Saylor, who were very generous and hospitable to this young man from the Valleys of Wales. At U Penn, Ian Davies was also well schooled in Clinical Periodontology by Prof Robert Gottsegen, who would later become a very prominent Professor of Periodontology in Columbia University, New York.

Ian Davies returned to London equipped with many newly acquired skills to take up a teaching position in United Christian Hospital. He embarked upon basic research studies on the mechanisms of tooth support with colleagues, and started forging a teaching career. It was not long before he was poached by the Royal Dental Hospital (RDH) of London School of Dental Surgery to head up its Periodontology Department, which had a very high standing among Periodontology Departments in the UK at the time. Ian Davies found himself working with many dedicated and talented colleagues at RDH, living in Bloomsbury and enjoying London life to the full.

But the commencement of dental education at The University of Hong Kong (HKU) provided too great an opportunity to be passed by, and so Ian Davies left London and found himself becoming the first Professor of Periodontology and Public Health at HKU and being one of the founding fathers of Dental Studies at HKU, working from the top floor of the Patrick Manson Building within the then Faculty of Medicine on Sassoon Road. Very shortly after Dental Studies was disestablished and the Faculty of Dentistry was established, Ian Davies became Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry and Director of the Prince Philip Dental Hospital, positions he held from 1983 to 1989, during the pivotal formative years of the Faculty and the Hospital. His administrative skills led to his being appointed as a Pro-Vice-Chancellor (PVC) at HKU in 1991. In 1992 he stepped down from being the Head of the Department of Periodontology and Public Health, but maintained his clinical activities and teaching duties at the Dental Faculty, while becoming more immersed in HKU administration as a PVC, variously overseeing Staffing, Research and Administration, ending up as Registrar to boot. Ian Davies had chaired the Dentists Subcommittee of the Medical Development Advisory Committee and had been involved in the consultative process with the Working Party on Postgraduate Medical Education and Training which produced "The Halnan Report", recommending that dental surgeons should also be part of the proposed Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM). Ian Davies was the second President (1995-99) of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong (CDSHK) during a period of consolidation of the CDSHK and the structuring of education and training in the various specialties in Dentistry, and setting up conjoint examinations with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh (RCS Edin).

Ian Davies was HKU's 13th Vice-Chancellor from 2000 to 2002 during a period of increasing globalisation and strengthening research performance.

In recognition of his services to dentistry and academia in Hong Kong he was awarded various Honorary Fellowships: FHKAM, FCDSHK, and FDSRCS Edin. HKU awarded him an Honorary Doctorate, and the first Chief Executive of the HKSAR bestowed on him a Silver Bauhinia Star. May he now rest in peace, having achieved much.


New Fellowship Card





The occasion also marked a historical moment whereby WHO Director General witnessed the successful International accreditation of the Shanghai General Practice training program by the World Organization of Family Doctors (WONCA). The President hosted a panel discussion on "Reviewing the Progress of General Practice in the past year, Blueprinting the Development of Asian Family Doctors for the near future". The Forum was well attended by around 1000 healthcare professional and leaders, especially family doctors.

The President Dr Donald Li was invited by World Health Organization Western Pacific Region to speak at a Breakfast Meeting on “Deepening Health Reform in China Value-Based Health Care Delivery” in Beijing. He spoke on “Strengthening Primary Care in China”. It was attended by Dr Jim Kim, President of World Bank, Dr Margaret Chan, Director General of WHO and Dr Shin Youn-soo, WHO Regional Director, along with senior officials from both World Bank and WHO, international Finance Corporation as well as vice ministers of the Health and Finance Ministries of People’s Republic of China.

Dr Donald Li, WONCA Executive member-at-large, was invited by World Health Organization and World Bank to participate in a meeting to discuss about China’s Healthcare reform. He was amongst two speakers who were invited to present and was asked to speak on strengthening primary care in China sharing his experience in promoting family medicine over the last 20 years. The meeting was attended by vice Ministers of Finance and Health of China and the President of World Bank, Jim Yong Kim, his Vice Presidents and directors, Vice President of the International finance Corporation as well as Director General of World Health Organization Dr Margaret Chan, the Regional Director of Western Pacific Shin Young-soo, country representatives and assistants.

Dr Li commented on challenges faced in strengthening primary care in China which included:

1. manpower issues, capacity building, training to meet the needs of the population,
2. the need to train family doctors in leadership and administration to enable them to be true managers of a multidisciplinary primary healthcare team,
3. the need for other specialists to understand the concept of family medicine through training,
4. the need to recognize that family doctors are specialists equal to hospital based specialists, and the financial incentives and reward for family doctors , and how to attract students and graduates to go into family medicine,
5. the need for primary care research to generate evidence that supports the cost effectiveness and improved health come through the practice of family medicine and
6. the need for proper community perception, appreciation of family medical practice and increased health literacy.
7. resource allocation to support the education and training of family doctors and
8. to continue to upgrade the rural practitioners which accounted for a big percentage of the primary healthcare workforce.
9. Setting up of well resourced community centers which were linked with Grade A hospitals for branding as well as providing confidence to the patients. Appropriate I.T. Support such as establishing electronic health records should be a priority.

Dr Li made recommendations to enhance the training program of family doctors to include community orientated primary care, leadership and suggested setting up structured quality assurance programs, as well as regulatory bodies such as a medical council to improve accountability and responsibilities. He also made recommendations to enhance health literacy of the public and alter their health seeking behavior, influence their value and expectations. He urged government to support patient empowerment and mutual support groups.

His recommendation to the administration was to have policies that supported primary care in particular reimbursement policies that promote the gate keeping role of family doctors. Innovation in medical insurance allowing co payment would also promote quality through reward. Registering patients with a family doctor to establish continuity could be achieved through medical insurance maneuvers.

Lastly Dr Li reported on the successful accreditation of the Family Doctor training program in Shanghai, introduced WONCA and encouraged other provinces in china to obtain accreditation. The successful accreditation witnessed by WHO DG was a great encouragement to GPs .
